Transparency and Accountability is a right of every member of ISGH on all leadership. Open communication and welcoming all points of view on decisions should be a built-in process. ISGH is the amanaah of the community. As such, all financial records, decisions, and meetings should be made public. Any large business transactions, construction projects, bylaw amendments, or transfer of funds should be communicated to the membership prior to any decision by the Board.
